**WINNIPEG ROWING CLUB:
PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE – SATURDAY JUNE 18TH**

Winnipeg MB (June 14, 2011) --Now that the Red River is finally starting to recede in Winnipeg, it's time to get on the water and become part of one of Canada's most successful Olympic sports!

Members of the public are invited to visit the Winnipeg Rowing Club (WRC) this coming weekend, during the annual open house:

Rowing is a lifelong sport for fitness, for competition, or just for fun, and the WRC offers rowing programs for all ages and skill levels. Whether you are interested in a recreational pursuit, or exploring the potential of a competitive sport, you are invited to come to the open house to find out more about rowing. It's a chance to tour the facilities, learn about indoor training, check out the boats and boathouse, watch rowers in action, and even try out some 'docksides' rowing.

At 130 years old, the Winnipeg Rowing Club is one of the oldest sporting organizations in Western Canada. It has been in operation since 1881, stopping only twice – during WWI and WWII. A long-time tenant of the banks of the Red River in downtown Winnipeg, the WRC survived the North-West Rebellion of 1885, the General Strike of 1919, the Great Depression of the 1930's, the Great Flood of 1950, and the Flood of the Century in 1997. Over the years the clubhouse has been destroyed by fire, wind, and water, but has always managed to maintain its long and proud tradition. Today, the WRC is a non-profit organization with a rich and successful sporting history, fostering generations of camaraderie and friendships. Members range from 13 to 85, and the club offers programs for all skill levels.
